
The Gospel According to Greg - week 2 - God Doesn't Play Games

that 'God' was just a placeholder

for what we don't know. The Gap.

"God doesn't play games" means... God doesn't have arbitrary rules, unreasonable expectations, act from anger, play favorites, capricious, give us brains only to tempt us to use them and think for ourselves.

We start believing in a game playing God for many reasons, often it is because we have a **GAP THEOLOGY**.



A God of the Gap is not worth believing in, trusting, or following.

To get rid of a game playing God, also realize that... Neither God nor Jesus need or want CREDIT.

God and Jesus only want to make you WHOLE and each of us PART OF one another.

The big themes of the Bible steer us away from a game playing God.

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say, for they were terrified.

Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!' Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

Mark 9.2-9

This story isn't about WHO Jesus is, it's about WHAT JESUS DOES.

The transfiguration (Mark 9) isn't about what happened on the 6th day. It's <u>DAY 7</u> that matters!

God isn't BIG, God just IS.

Why is this important?

A game playing God separates us from <u>OURSELVES</u> and <u>ONE ANOTHER</u> as we try to satisfy the desires of God.

A game playing God separates us from GOD by making God utterly OTHER. Unknowable, unapproachable, foreign.

We need to see God as that which pulls us together, weaves us into one.

You cannot look deeply into **GOD** without seeing your **NEIGHBOR**.

And you can't look deeply into the eyes of your NEIGHBOR without seeing GOD.

The Bible isn't sacred until you look <u>THROUGH IT</u>, not <u>AT IT</u>. The Bible is a lens to look through to see ourselves, the world, and God.

HOMEWORK - Do you sometimes fall for the Gap Theology trap? Letting God be part of what you don't understand and operating single-strandedly when you think you understand. Take a closer look at how you may be missing the real presence of God in each of those scenarios.
