We have tools at our disposal!!


The wellness wheel is one of them,.

The Lie of Rootless Individualism

Whether we like it or not, we are ROOTED
There's temptation to SEPARATE FROM our roots
...and there are plenty of forces willing to fill the void...

Take a brief inventory of your rootedness: which roots give you grounding? Life? Location? Belonging? Hope? Direction? Courage?



HOMEWORK: Spend some time really examining your roots. who are the people; what are the stories, experiences, cultures, traditions, or rituals that have sustained you across time? What does it mean to you that we are each rooted?



ROAM (Read, Observe, Apply, Meditate) through Matthew 13:6 a couple times. This verse is part of a larger story, but take a moment to consider how *your* roots have sustained when you've felt scorched? Notice what it feels like to recognize the strength and beauty in those roots!



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
