LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT Where we are and the story of our land matters. Most of us live in, and we gather in land that was part of the Dakota people for centuries, but from which they were forcibly and dishonorably removed by the US government. It is an honor and a responsibility for us to live on and care for this land today.



Life is the **WEAVING** of the 3 strands.

Jesus spoke in this sense when he said what the most important commandment was:

You shall love Yahweh (I Am Who I Am, the name of God in the Bible) with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. And you shall love your neighbor as you love yourself. Mark 12.30-31

The wisdom book, Ecclesiastes, points at this in the Old Testament of the Bible as well:

Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up the other; but woe to one who is alone and falls and does not have another to help. Again, if two lie together, they keep warm; but how can one keep warm alone? And though one might prevail against another, two will withstand one.

A threefold cord is not quickly broken. Ecclesiastes 4.9-12

And sometimes we put a **KNOT** in those woven strands.

A knot is an experience that **HOLDS TOGETHER** the weaving in your life.

What turns an experience into a Knot experience?

- NOTICE it.
- NAME it.
- MARK it.
- REMEMBER it.

Your stories of growth may be <u>PERSONAL</u>, but they aren't meant to be <u>PRIVATE</u>.

They are meant to be **SHARED**. Tell the story!

In the future your children will ask you, 'What do these stones mean?' Then you can tell them, 'They remind us that the Jordan River stopped flowing when the Ark of Yahweh's Covenant went across.' These stones will stand as a memorial among the people of Israel forever.

HOMEWORK: Take time to think about this, to write it down, and even to talk to someone about it. Maybe this is a good Group discussion this week: What was a knot experience that you noticed, named, marked, and remembered well? How did you do it? And what is another in your life, or someone's life close to you, that could use a good knot? How could you help tie it?
